VI ANGELS CAN SIN JUST LIKE YOU AND ME

- A) Angels and the motive to sin—not desires of the flesh (Gal. 6:7,8; Luke 12; 1 John 2:15-17) but of the mind (Gal. 1:8,9; 2 Cor. 11:1-3)
- B) Angels and the primary words used for sin
 - 1) Transgression (rebellion): 1 John 3:4; Job 4:18; 2 Pet. 2:4; Jude 6; Mat. 25:41; Rev. 12:7-9)
 - 2) Iniquity (perversion of that which is right): 1 John 5:17; Gen. 19; Deu. 33:2; Acts 7:53; Gal. 3:19; Heb. 2:2
 - 3) Sin (missing the mark): 2 Pet. 2:4
- C) Angels and the impossibility of their redemption
 - 1) We have redemption in Jesus (Eph. 1:7; Col. 1:4; 1 Pet.1:18,19)
 - 2) God does not give this option to His angels (Heb. 2:16,17)

- G) Exodus 14:19,20—the angel of God went before the camp of Israel
- H) Exodus 23:20-23—the angel of God would keep Israel by the way and had the power to forgive sins
- I) Exodus 33:1-3,12-16—God took away the special angel from Israel until Moses interceded
- J) Numbers 22:8-35—appearance to Balaam
- K) Joshua 5:13-15—appearance to Joshua

- A) The Pentateuch was revealed by angels (Deu. 33:2; Acts 7:53; Gal. 3:19; Heb. 2:2)
- B) It is possible that the Holy Spirit's message on the day of Pentecost was actually given to the apostles by angels (Heb. 1:7; 2:1-4)
- C) The book of Revelation was revealed by an angel (Rev. 1:1; 22:6; 16)—the identity of the angel is unknown (cf. Dan. 8:16; 9:21; Zec. 1:9,14)

XI ANGELS ARE AMBASSADORS OF DIVINE PROVIDENCE

- A) Angels ministered to God's people in Bible times miraculously.
 - 1) They provided for physical needs (1 Kings 19:1-8)
 - 2) They provided emotional support at times (Luke 22:43; Acts 27:23,24)
 - 3) They were involved in guarding God's people from harm (Mat. 2:13,14; Dan. 6:21,22; Acts 5:12-20; 12:1-11)—this is not the same as the false doctrine of "Guardian Angels."
 - 4) They will take us away at death (Luke 16:22,23).
- B) Angels minister to God's people today through providence (Heb. 1:14)
 - 1) Biblical examples of angels and providence.

 - (c) Mat. 24:31
